#### **TOP HAND** (Ralph Hand--Ranch Manager)

Howdy, Pardners!

Spring is here, the rains finally came and filled the pond, and the crew together with a few dedicated owners has begun the spring cleaning chores. Most noteworthy of all are the horses at the recreation center who are all getting a new and much needed repainting thanks to Jim Chavera and Bobby and Mason Crowell. The horses are really looking good once more. Be sure to thank these owners for their efforts. We'll be getting a few more flowers to add to those who made it through the year out front of the rec. center. And . . . . our "new" trees that Dave LaField planted and Lisa Dell has kept watered are thriving with new blossoms and leaves.

With thoughts for still finding ways to keep our expenses low, we have obtained two more mini trucks to use in place of the big gas hogs. One of the new ones is a "flat bed" to be used down at the stables, and the other is for maintenance.

With all of the recent rain we've enjoyed, the pond has finally filled and we're able to go ahead with our order of fish and are setting Sat. April 19th as the date for our fish derby. As you will recall, we were going to have the derby at the usual Presidents' weekend in February, but our pond bore a resemblance to a large mud puddle, and the fish farm was low on stock due to the drought. A few rain dances later, we finally got enough water to go forward with the fishing derby. There are still fish in the pond right now and I've seen a few nice ones caught already this year.

Adding the fishing derby to an already full array of events for Easter weekend is going to mean a real action-packed holiday and lots of fun for the families. We'll also have Easter services at 10 a.m. on Sunday. Be sure to pick up a schedule of events at the main gate so you'll know the times and places to be. I heard also that the Easter Bunny was planning to stop by during the egg hunt so be sure to bring cameras along for those precious Kodak moments. The Red Bluff Roundup is also that weekend and the ranch is once again the sponsor for the grand entry for all three days. If you are interested in joining in the rodeo parade, be sure to go down to the barn and get signed up. This event is always an outstanding representation of rodeo and the cowboy way. We'll also have our information booth down there and they always need help to handle the crowd of info seekers. Along with spring and the warm weather come some of our not-so-nice-to-run-into neighbors who share the ranch environment with us. Take a few minutes to go over some words of caution with regard to the poison oak, baby and full grown rattlesnakes, and our local variety of scorpions so everyone is aware of what to leave alone

We're starting a pilot project with the upcoming Easter weekend, and I'm asking that all the owners give us their cooperation and help us work through a situation that is becoming more and more of a problem. We have been encountering people on the ranch who are not owners but are unregistered guests. This means that no releases have been signed, and these same releases do offer some degree of protection for the ranch and the owner. A recent incident has shown an unsuspecting owner just how important these releases can be in the event of an injury accident. We have also had owners who have encountered strangers in the back country who are hunting on our ranch and who have avoided going through the main gate. In an effort to put an

end to the unregistered trespassers and poachers, we'll be asking everyone who is legitimately on the ranch to wear a wrist band. If you see someone without a wrist band, please alert security and they will handle the situation.

These bands will have colors that denote an owner or guest, and the colors will change weekly. We'll be putting extra help at the gate during the weekend to help move things along.

As I said, this is a pilot program. I know you owners may have some other ideas to help eliminate this problem and I sincerely welcome any suggestions to help remedy this situation. In the meantime, we're trying to find a way to protect you owners and your ranch. Thank you in advance for your patience, understanding and cooperation.

#### R Wild Horse Ranch Fire Committee Report **April 2014**

Hello All fellow Owners: Thank you for your continuing contributions to the red bucket campaign. We have been able to assist with some outfitting of the new squad which is now fully functional! Chief John Brown and Bobby Philps did an outstanding job - you need to go up to the shop to see and admire it! Let's hope we don't need to use it!

There has been considerable rain at the Ranch but we are NOT out of the drought yet! Even though the rain is approaching 50% of normal (17.5" versus normal is 29.75"), this is the THIRD year of below normal rainfall/precipitation. When you come to the Ranch, it may appear that all is well but please remember we are in a drought and take appropriate precautions with fire. This includes checking your spark arrestors on ATVs, motorcycles, etc. before going into the outback.

There is nothing planned in the near future for additional money making ideas, but we will be working on it! If you have any ideas, please feel free to contact one of the committee or the WHOA Office to leave a message and we will get back to you. Our next meeting will be at 2:00 PM after the Board Meeting in May at the WHOA Office.

#### EMERGENCY PROCEDURES for ALL OWNERS

The key to successfully handling any Emergency is to remain calm and know what to do! Report any fire or smoke immediately!

In the event of a personal emergency on the Ranch, there are yellow call boxes located at the gates, Upper Lodge, Recreation Center, the two cookhouses, several bath houses (when you arrive on the Ranch, check the closest bath house to you with a call box) and the Stables. Go to one of these call boxes; relate the nature of the emergency, location of the emergency and your name. If the Emergency is in the Outback or Horse Area, remain at the box to assist in directing Emergency Response Personnel to the location of the injured person(s).

If an Emergency involves the entire Ranch (such as a fire), evacuate to the Runway near the Pond Area. Do **NOT** bring trailers, or other bulky items! (Remember the trailer can be replaced – You can't be!!) Ranch Staff have a plan to notify owners present on the Ranch of the Emergency and there is an Emergency siren as well. On the runway, do NOT block the left lane of any exit. These lanes need to remain clear for access by Emergency Vehicles. From the Runway, Owners will be directed on which route to take to evacuate the Ranch. If it is necessary to "shelter in place" (stay at the Pond), Owners will be directed on how this is to be accomplished. It is imperative for your safety and the safety of others to remain calm, proceed in an orderly manner to the

It is imperative for your safety and the safety of others to remain calm, proceed in an orderly manner to the Runway and follow all directions given to you by Ranch Personnel.

#### R-RANCH OWNERS:

DUE TO THE AMOUNT OF TRESPASSING IN THE SURROUNDING PRIVATE PROPERTIES, THESE RANCHERS HAVE NOTIFIED THE AUTHORITIES. TRESPASSERS WIL BE CITED.

ATVs, Motorcycles, Golf Carts, and any similar Recreation Vehicles

- 1. All vehicles must obey the 10 MPH Speed Limit (except in ATV area)
- 2. All ATVs, Quads, Motorcycles, Golf Carts, Go Carts, and Dual Passenger Off Road Vehicles, Etc, must have their Owner Number displayed. Numbers are available at the front gate for a small fee.
- 3. All Guests of Owners operating motorized recreational vehicles on the Ranch, must be accompanied by the Owner or Designated User and have the Owners number displayed on the vehicle.
- 4. All riders under the age of 14 years must be accompanied by an adult or designated guardian, 18 years
- 5. All riders under the age of 18 years are required to wear a DOT approved helmet.
- 6. ATVs, Quads, motorcycles may not be ridden with more than 1 rider, unless vehicle is designed to carry more than 1 rider.
- 7. ATVs, motorcycles, Quads, Golf Carts, and any other rolling stock ridden after dark must be equipped with functioning headlights, taillights and brake lights.
- Vehicles 36" or less at handlebars, ATVs, motorcycles, Quads and similar vehicles, must mount a flag on a pole riser to provide visibility to other vehicles.
- 9. All ATVs, Quads, motorcycles and similar vehicles are restricted to the paved roads while in the developed areas of the Ranch. Riding around the cabin area is prohibited.
- 10. All ATVs, Quads, motorcycles and similar vehicles are not allowed in the stable area
- 11. All ATVs, Quads, motorcycles and similar vehicles are to stay on developed roads outback except in the 900 acres set aside for them. All vehicles must obey the 10MPH outback except in the designated ATV area.

Election for the 2014—2016 term for the Board of Directors will be held at the Annual Owners Meeting and Election in Aug. 2014. There will be two seats up for election.

If you are interested in running for the Board you can pick up an informational packet from the WHOA office starting May 1, 2014. Your resume has to be turned in by June 1, 2014.

All winners of the R-Wild Horse Ranch PLM late season deer hunt to be held November 18, 19 and 20, 2014 must be an owner in good standing (assessments must be current) of the R-Wild Horse Ranch at the time of the hunt. Winners must have a current California hunting license and "B" zone deer tag.

The "B" zone deer tag must be exchanged for the PLM tag. This is a requirement of the Department of Fish and Game so that no hunter can harvest more than two (2) deer in the State of California.

All PLM tag winners will be allowed one (1) person to accompany them on their hunt to help them spot game and retrieve harvested animals. The accompanying person is NOT allowed to carry or possess a firearm while in the PLM hunting area.

PLM winners and their companions with vehicles, ATV's, 4x4's, motorcycles, etc, must stay on roads.

Property boundaries will be marked by fences, blue paint markings, blue ribbon or signage. Maps will be available to tag winners.

Recipients of the PLM deer tag will also be able to hunt bear and wild pig, provided they have valid bear and pig tags.

This deer hunt is a three (3) point or better hunt; meaning the deer must have at least three (3) points on one (1) side NOT INCLUDING EYE GUARD-BROW TINE. Bear and pigs must be hunted according to State of California Fish and Game regulations and laws.

All animals harvested <u>MUST</u> be brought to the main gate for validation and record keeping for the PLM program. This is a requirement of the Department of Fish and Game. Also, this is an opportunity for photos for the R-Wild Horse Ranch Newsletter to help promote next years PLM hunt.

This is a three (3) day hunt only and the dates will change yearly as scheduled. The 2013 hunt will be held Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday November 18, 19 and 20, 2014.

There will be an orientation dinner at 7:00PM Monday evening November 17, 2014 at the upper lodge of the R-Wild Horse Ranch for tag winners and the person accompanying them.


